A Report on ADOPTION OF SCHOOL

Name of the school: Bhagya Das Adarsha Primary School,

Established 1994; Guimari, Rani

The Extension Education and career counseling cell of the college actively participated in the adoption of a school in the nearby locality and selected Bhagya Das Adarsha Primary school of Guimari villege in Rani, under Palashbari Block for **adoption in 2015**. This school was established in 1994 and it was provincialised in

2013. At that time there were two teachers by the names Mr. Anwar Hussain, acting as the Head Master (with working experience of 15 years) and the other Mr. Ranjit Choudhury who is the Assistant Teacher (with teaching experience of 23 years). The total land area of the school premises measure 2 bighas. It was donated by Mr.Haren Das of Mirza, in the name of his wife late Bhagya Das. The school building has been constructed by CRPF, Rani Block. The School has been provided with the facility of boys' toilet by Sarba Siksha Abhijan and another toilet for girls provided by the NHPC. Assam State Housing Board has provided the School with a kitchen where the Sarba Sikhsa Abhijan facilitated Mid Day Meal scheme which was being run successfully. There were two cooks (female) employed for cooking the Mid Day Meal for students, whose salary is also under support of Sarba Siksha Abhijan.

A total no. of 40 students (27 boys and 13 girls) were there in the school (class I to V) in 2015 having only 1 class room for the 5 classes. The school uniform of navy blue pant/ skirt and white shirt was also provided by Sarba Siksha Abhijan. The students used to sit on the mats on the floor.

Majority of the people in the village belongs to ST(P) and OBC castes and most of the people are engaged in cultivation and daily wage earning. On our first visit to the school on **05-05-2015**, it was noticed that there was no proper boundary in the school compound. Considering the prevailing poor infrastructure and lack of proper facilities in the school, the college decided to help by providing sitting arrangements and other required facilities to the school as far as possible within our limited means.

Regular visits to the school were made by the members of the extension cell with the Principal of the college.

Immediately after the first visit, five pairs of desk and bench, one wall-clock, one water filter and a big sign board with name and address of the school on it were provided in the first phase on **22-05-2015**.

It was observed that there was no English teacher in the school. Accordingly, an English teacher from the college has been taking classes from time to time in the school.

At present the school needs another four class rooms and a teachers' common room and for these, substantial fund is required. However, our college is not having such amount of fund for these activities and therefore not able to take up all infrastructural works. Request has been made to the local Sangha in this regard. A meeting has also been held at the village wherein the villagers have been informed about the poor plight of the school and they have been requested to approach the education department for necessary assistance.

As it is not feasible for the college teachers to take classes in the school on regular basis because of the distance and lack of proper public transport, the extension cell has also taken initiatives to identify volunteers from the village and adjoining areas to act as part time teachers in the school. So far 2 volunteers by the names Mrs. Binita Goswami and Pankaj Mazumdar have been taking classes on a regular basis.

The NAAC Peer Team during inspection of Paschim Guwahati Mahavidyalaya visited Bhagya Das Adarsha Primary School on **22nd September, 2015**.

The team was impressed during the interaction with the students, teachers, School Managing Committee members and local villagers. As a good will gesture, the team offered to present ceiling fans and also offered to give a laptop to be presented to the school. The entire gathering was overwhelmed by the generosity of the NAAC Peer team and this day is undoubtedly a Red Letter Day in the history of the college.

A community feast was arranged by the college on **22nd January, 2016** wherein the students, villagers, SMC Members and members from the college were present. On this day, the laptop donated by NAAC peer team member was handed over to the Head Master of the School.

A tree plantation drive was taken up that day in the school premises and at different locations in the village. The people of the locality appreciated the initiative of the college.

On **24th May, 2016**, 4 nos. of ceiling fans were donated to the school out of which 3 were fitted in the classroom and one was fitted in the teachers' common room. The NAAC Peer Team members had donated an amount for two fans and the other two were bought with the collections from the faculty members and the Principal.

On **3rd February, 2017** a team from college visited the school and about 100 nos. of books were donated by the faculty members and the Principal of the college along with an almirah (copy of the list is enclosed herewith). In addition, 5 more pairs of desks and benches were also donated on the same day.

At present there are only 19 students altogether, 9 boys and 10 girls and as such the number of cook has been reduced to only 1.

The teachers from the college had visited the school periodically and took classes on Mathematics, English, Assamese and Environmental Studies. In addition a teacher from the college also taught them to sing Sanskrit morals on one of his visits

Dr. Malati Baruah, Specialist in Maternal and Child Health, former DHS, Assam and Dr. Nilima Goswami Retired Professor, Aryavidyapeeth College and social worker also accompanied the group from the college.

ADOPTION OF VILLAGE Village Guimari and Hakkhabari, Rani

Introduction:

Paschim Guwahati Mahavidyalaya had adopted a school **Bhagya Das Adarsha Primary School** of Guimari village in Rani, under Palashbari Block in **2015**. The college had also looked into various needs of the village Guimari and had taken up several plans for the upliftment of the village including the school.

The village Guimari under Revenue village Nargaon consists of an area of 517 hectare. It is under the Rani Development Block and Revenue Circle is Palasbari. The village has a total number of population around 1037. The main occupation of the people in the village is Agriculture and daily wage earning. There are 5 Anganwadi centres, 3 government primary schools and 1 government Middle English school. Majority of the people in the village belong to ST(P) and OBC.

The adopted school Bhagya Das Adarsha Prathamik Vidyalaya falls in between **Village Guimari and Hakkhabari** and the college now proposes to adopt both the villages.

Total No. of population in the two villages is around 370. Out of which male population 187, and female 183. The people in the villages belong to different castes such as ST(P), OBC and general caste. Following is a rough data:

ST-103, **OBC-** 149 and **General** 118.

There are two Anganwadi Centres and one Medical Sub Centre.

And there is only one Govt. Primary School namely, Bhagya Das Adarsha Primary School which we have adopted.

During our visits to the village it was gathered that

- i) The literacy rate is very low and most of the people are cultivators and very few are engaged in Govt. jobs.
- ii) Financial conditions of the people are hand to mouth.
- iii) Drinking water supply mostly individual and not hygienic.
- iv) There are number of social problems and the overall social atmosphere is not healthy.
- v) However, the sanitation system seems to be quite satisfactory and they have received the facilities provided by the Govt. authorities.

Objective:

Considering the above, with an intention of all round upliftment of the village and the community therein and to make them aware of the importance of education, health and hygiene, environmental issues, cultural richness and schemes offered by Government the college wishes to adopt the village Guimari and village Hakkhabari from now on.

However, even during our earlier visits to the adopted school we tried to include the guardians and specially the women folk in our awareness programmes in the school and the Anganwadi Centre in the school complex.

Programmes Adopted So Far:

On 22nd January, 2016 a community feast was organized and the members from the college interacted with the local people regarding importance of education and health and hygiene in the school complex.

The faculty members roamed inside the village and tried to get an idea about the people, place and the overall environment of the village.

On 23rd May, 2017 the Principal and the members of the Extension Education Cell visited the village and met the villagers at the Anganwadi Centre. Dr. Malati Baruah, Specialist in Maternal and Child Health, former DHS, Assam and Dr. Nilima Goswami, Retired Professor, Aryavidyapeeth College and social worker who accompanied the group from the college, talked to the assembled people about women and child health care and responded to the various queries from the audience. About 40 women attended the programme.
