





### A BRIEF HISTORY:

Located in the western fringe of the fast-expanding Guwahati city, Paschim Guwahati Mahavidyalaya was established on 5th September,1978. In its 46 years of existence till date, the college has been continuously scaling new heights, crossing notable milestones in its academic and co-curricular activities. Situated beside the Deepar Beel, the college has a lush green environment which is a sight to behold. Thanks to the foresight and immense social commitment of founder-Principal Late Bipin Chandra Baruah along with a group of likeminded individuals, this institute of higher learning was set up with the noble mission of developing precious human resource. From a humble beginning with a single Assam-type house, the college has grown into a multi-storeyed complex along with fisheries and a grove of medicinal plants. This growth of physical infrastructure has come as a natural corollary to the primary focus of the college in building up asocial capital, by training its students to excel in academic pursuits and other diverse fields. Many of them have brought laurels to the college by succeeding in the State and National level events.

Paschim Guwahati Mahavidyalaya today is a full-fledged degree college imparting Higher Education in Arts and Commerce, along with a plethora of courses under GUCDOE (Gauhati University Centre for Distance and Online Learning), KKHSOU (Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University) and other certificate courses etc. The Arts stream of the college had been brought under the deficit – grant – in – aid system by the Assam Government in the year1996 and provincialized in the year 2005. Teaching posts of the commerce stream have been provincialized as per the Assam Venture Educational Institution (Provincialisation of Service) Act, 2011 and amended in 2012 with respect to degree colleges of Assam. Paschim Guwahati Mahavidyalaya has been accredited by NAAC in 2004, 2015 and 2022 and it had been registered under 2(F) and 12(B)of the UGCAct,1956 in February, 2005. The College is permanently affiliated to Gauhati University. For the first time in its history the

college could achieve an other milestone in the teaching-learning process by introducing post-graduate course in Political Science and Assamese from 2020-21 session and BCA from 2022-23 session under Gauhati University. The College also regularly serves as a venue for different examinations on Sundays. Lastyear Paschim Guwahati Mahavidyalaya had been re accredited by NAAC and the College had been able to achieve B+ grade from C++and B Grades in the years 2004 and 2015 respectively.

### **ABOUT THE COLLEGE:**

### THE COLLEGE CAMPUS

The college campus extends over 15 bighas of land, bordered by an M.V school and higher secondary school on one side. The lush green environment of open fields on the other sides, creates a healthy environment proper for an institution of higher learning.

The campus includes an Assam type block along with a three-storeyed RCC building connecting two blocks at a right angle housing the Principal's office, Teachers common rooms of Arts and Commerce departments, Committee room, classrooms, library, laboratories, students' common room and two well equipped conference rooms and an indoor sports complex. There is also a two storeyed Women's hostel in the college campus and the total seat capacity has been increased to 60. The canteen is in a separate Assam type house within the college campus. Well-maintained gardens along with shade-giving trees create a suitable ambience. The fishery of the college enhances the scenic beauty of the campus. Newly constructed Conference Hall at 1st floor on Bipin Chandra Baruah library has been

completed. Sufficient space has been kept aside for parking vehicles.


The newly built Bipin Chandra Baruah Library Building has been completed and fully digitalized.

### LOCATION OF THE COLLEGE

Paschim Guwahati Mahavidyalaya is situated at Dharapur Chariali, adjoining National Highway No. 17 on the way to Lokopriya Gopinath Bordoloi International Airport. North east India's only Ramsar site and world famous bird sanctuary 'Deepar Beel' is near by, while Gauhati University is approximately 4 kms away from the college. ### **LABORATORIES**

The Laboratories are associated with the Department of Education in Arts Faculty and Computer Education (Arts & Commerce). The college also possesses a language laboratory which had been constructed with RUSA funds housed near the English Department.



The Digital library is named after the Founder Principal of the college, Late Bipin Chandra Baruah. Over the years, there has been a substantial increase in the number of books in the library, numbering more than 41,000 at present. It is well stocked with texts and reference books, along with classics, several lexicons and encyclopedia series, as well as books of general interest covering a wide range of topics in English, Assamese, Bengali and Hindi. Book Bank facility is offered to the meritorious and poor students. The library also subscribes to journals and 7 newspapers, with an eye to keep the students up - to - date with current affairs. Computers have been installed with LAN/OPAC and SOUL2.0 software. There is separate reading space for students and teachers with 9 nos. of computers facilitating internet access in the e-resource Centre.

# NEP 2020 COURSE STRUCTURE STYUGP

The Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) of Gauhati University is as per UGC's Curriculum Framework, published in November 2022. The course structure of FYUGP is built on the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS).

Structure-wise, the present Bachelor's Degree programme under the CBCS is a 3-year degree programme at the end of which, a student will be awarded a Bachelor's Degree in Arts or Commerce. The Two systems - Bachelor's Course under CBCS and Bachelor's Course under the FYUGP of NEP are different in the following ways.

### **COLLEGE DURATION**

While under CBCS, one has a 3-year degree programme, under the NEP's FYUGP, it is a 4-year degree programme.

#### **EXITS & ENTRIES**

Under CBCS, one needs to complete the full 3-year programme in order to get a degree. There is no provision for dropping out of the programme in the middle. While in the FYUGP, one has choice to exit from the programme thrice – after one year, after two years, and after three years. If one exits the programme after one year, one gets a certificate. If one exits after two years, one gets a diploma. If one exits after three years, one gets a Bachelor's Degree. And finally if a student completes the whole 4-year, one gets a Bachelor's Degree (Honours).

### HONOURS AND MAJOR

Under the CBCS, we either have Bachelor's Degree (Honours) or a regular Bachelor's Degree. In FYUGP, we get a Bachelor's Degree with Major after 3 years and a degree with Major & Honours after 4 years.

### FIRST YEAR (SEMESTER I & II)

In the first year, one studies three different core subjects - one paper of each subject per semester. Besides, one needs to study a host of common subjects that we have designed as per UGC's Curricular Frame work. Details of these courses are described in the booklet.





PGM library is the soul of the institution and it acquires, processes, preserves and disseminates information to the user committee with the motto of empowering knowledge. It is a place where the students, teachers and other staffs had access to variety of resources.



#### LIBRARY RESOURCES

Our library has more than 41,153 reference books, 23,003 text books, 18150 e-books, more than 6000 e-journals and more 1,99,500 e-books through N-List platform and more than 60000 e-books through NDLI platform, 224 back volumes print journals, 7 newspapers like Asomiya Pratidin, Assam Tribune, The Times of India, Amar Asom, Niyomiya Barta, DainikPurvoday in English, Assamese and Hindi. We also have Dictionaries, Encyclopedias, Maps, Atlas, competitive exam books and General knowledge books. Apart from this the library has many good novels and story books in English, Assamese and Hindi.

#### LIBRARY FACILITIES

- Book Grant for meritorious students per semester
- 'Best library user' award is given to both teacher and student every year.
- Facility for e-resource centre is available for both teachers and students.
- Separate reading rooms are there both for teachers and students.

#### Library by-laws

- 1. No book is issued without library card and books are not transferable.
- 2. Two library cards are issued to each student for an academic session. An additional card is given to students having honours subject.
- 3. One book is issued against each card.
- 4. If the book is not returned within the stipulated time limit, a fine of Rs. 3/- is imposed per day per book upto 15 days and thereafter it is increased to Rs. 5/- per day.
- 5. Books may be retained for a period not exceeding 15 days by members.
- 6. Books may be renewed on request at the discretion of the Librarian.
- 7. Misuse of library book is a serious offence. Unless the borrower points out the damage at the time of borrowing the book, he/she shall be required to replace the book or pay its price.
- 8. Dog-earing the pages of a book, marking or writing therein with ink or pencil, tearing or taking out its pages, or otherwise damaging it and causing injury to the book will bring penalty.

# **Code of Conduct for Students**

1. The guideline for dress code for undergraduate/post graduate students in college campus:

#### (For undergraduate students):

- a) The college uniform for boys is yellow coloured check shirt and black trousers with college emblem.
- b) For the girls, there are two options-

Yellow coloured check Kameez (with emblem), white churni and white salwar (Semi Patiwala Design) with college emblem. Leggings Strictly prohibited.

In the winter season, both girls and boys can put on black sweater / coat.

Uniform cloth with college emblem (for both girls and boys) are arranged in the college office at reasonable price for the benefit of the students.

#### For Girls

- (ii) Mobile must be kept in silent mode in side the campus of the college.
- (iii) Gossiping and loitering inside the college campus is strictly prohibited.
- (iv) Students must carry their Identity cards while inside the college campus.
- v) Any violation of the code of conduct will invite disciplinary action extending upto expulsion from the college.

#### Important Note on Prohibition of Ragging & Harassment

As per UGC Guideline [no.F1-16/2007(CPP-II), April, 2009], all forms of ragging in hostels and the college campus are prohibited, Ragging is considered as a cognizable offence under the law of the land and ragging in all its forms is totally banned in the entire institution, including its departments, constituent units, all its premises (academic, residential, sports, canteen etc.) whether located within the campus or outside and in all means of transportation of students whether public or private. Punishable ingredients of Ragging are (1) Abetment of Ragging; (2) Criminal conspiracy to rag; (3) Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging; (4) Public nuisance created during ragging; (5) Violation of decency and morals through ragging; (6) Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt; (7) Wrongful restraint; (8) Wrongful confinement; (9) Use of criminal force; (10) Assault as well as sexual offences or unnatural offences; (11) Extortion; (12) Criminal trespass; (13) Offences against property; (14) Criminal intimidation; (15) Attempts to commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim; (16) Physical or psychological humiliation; (17) All other offences following from the definition of "Ragging".

# Following strong disciplinary action may be taken if anyone is found to be involved directly or indirectly in ragging:

- Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- Withholding, withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
- Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
- Withholding results.
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival etc.
- Suspension / Expulsion from the hostel.
- ... Cancellation of admission.
- Rustication from the institution for period ranging from 1 to 2 years.
- \* Expulsion for the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for specified period.
- Fine ranging between Rs.25,000/-and Rs.1,00,000/-
- Collective punishment: when the persons committing or abetting the crime or ragging are not identified, the authority will resort to collective punishment.


